The second is lectionary which follow a prescribed set of verses from the Revised Common Lectionary and looking for the thread that is inherent in the verses, which usually move through a certain book. I have utilized both types but have moved to the Lectionary during the COVID crisis. Somehow it has seemed more like being home for me. It is a way to allow someone other than myself to guide the lessons. The Gospel lectionary for this season has had a strange turn in it, moving from Mark to John for several weeks, specifically John 7 and the bread discourses. It may have seemed strange to focus on such a small segment of scripture for so many weeks but we know it wasn't about bread at all; it was about who Jesus is and how he was accepted by the leaders of the Pharisee sect.

The Pharisees were not bad people. They wanted to keep their faith pure and do what they believed God wanted. They thought that keeping the law perfectly would please God but they didn't know what they didn't know. They did not understand that God was choosing to deal with humanity in a different way through the incarnation. God's breaking into our temporal life by sending Jesus to live among us was a different way of and like us and invites us to enter the world of others so

being in a relationship with humanity. Pharisees did not expect God to act in any way other than through the law and the prophets as God had in the past. We

There are two primary methods of preaching or actually have the benefit of 2000 years to look back and see how for that matter. The twelve closest to Jesus did not understand until after his death either.

> What are we missing because we cannot let go of our past understandings and grow into our future? The one thing I am always sure of is that we all need to keep learning and growing. We need to learn to see through the eyes of others and hear through their ears so we can understand how they experience the world. Jesus was, in fact, God experiencing the world as we experience the world — opening Godself to what it means to be one of us, to be human, to be tempted, to experience human pain. We are not great at experiencing life through others' eyes. When someone is experiencing a loss, pain, oppression, fear, we often think we understand but we do not fully understand their emotional/social situation because we are not them.

> Hopefully, we are always growing in our love for God and others and learning what it is like to experience the world as others experience the world. While I know it is impossible to fully understand what others are experiencing, it is possible to better understand what they are experiencing. God enters our world to be with we can walk beside them.



The Finance Committee appreciates your contributions and donations. With your support we will be able to continue sharing God's love with those around us.




