Dear Friends and Members of First United Methodist Church of Titusville,

For many churches, Easter Sunday will have the largest attendance of the year!
Rosanna Anderson, Ken Sloane, and Taylor Burton-Edwards have suggested 7
tips for getting ready for Easter Sunday and the Great 50 Days that Follow it.

- **1. Be an inviting Christian:** Use every means at your disposal to invite people to worship with you on Easter Sunday. Let people know that Easter Sunday is a wonderful day to try out our church or reconnect with the church. Include details -- such as worship times and parking that will help new folks.
- 2. Be a welcoming Christian: Make sure you are welcoming new and returning Easter worshippers.
- **3. Be an attractive Church:** Do what you can to make sure that our buildings and grounds are in top shape. Walk around and view everything with fresh eyes to see what could help visitors. Make plans to help our grounds and memorial garden team clean-up and spruce up on Saturday, April 1 @ 7am (No foolin'!).
- **4. Be a missional Christian:** Find ways to let people know how our church is touching people's lives. Use the bulletin, newsletter or your own experiences to share how we are agents of transformation locally and globally. Support the Easter theme by providing concrete examples of places where the church has helped offer hope in the tombs of despair, where those the world had written off are raised up to new life! Connect the Easter story in ways that show that the risen Christ has power! Help out with our annual Egg Hunt on Saturday, April 15th @ 10:30am.
- **5. Be an inclusive Church:** As we worship, be conscious of the presence of people who may be unfamiliar with the traditions of our congregation's worship or Christian worship all together. For some newcomers (and especially children, they may need a little help), we invite people to open Bibles and read along. (We include page numbers so people who haven't memorized the order of the books of the Bible can easily find "2 Corinthians.")
- **6. Be an authentic Christian:** Do all you can to keep this Easter from being a "One-Morning Stand." Build on the momentum and intentionally follow up with people. Give everyone a flier or postcard about an event such as a service project, meal, or fellowship activity scheduled soon after Easter. Make sure everyone in the congregation knows that the Sundays after Easter are important. After Easter, let first time attenders know that "Our Easter was more joyful because you were with us." That way Easter season can be full of Easter joy!
- **7. Be a prepared Christian:** Easter is a great time to invite all of our newcomers to an upcoming series of services: called "Following the Resurrection Path." This way we will show that Easter, like Lent, is actually a season designed, since its inception in the early church, to help the newly baptized or other newcomers identify the Spirit's gifts in their lives, prepare them for ministry in the world, and deepen their understanding of core Christian teachings.

District Superintendent - Rev. Gary Spencer's Column

We had a great weekend last month with Bishop Carter and Dr. Reggie McNeal who led workshops in the north and south(only Reggie) part of our district. There were over 350 people in attendance and I heard from many that the training they brought was very insightful.

For those who were not there let me share my big takeaway. The Church must engage the community and bring God's Kingdom to those who live around our churches. The Church has become church-centric. This means we have for maybe one thousand plus years, spent most of our resources – people and money – on ourselves. Reggie says in his book "Missional Renaissance:"

"Externally focused ministry leaders take their cues from the environment around them in terms of needs and opportunities. They look for ways to bless and to serve the communities where they are located. Much of their calendar space, financial resources, and organizational energy is spent on people who are not a part of their organization." (p.7)

My hope is each church, as they review their vitality plan for their church, commits to connecting with their community through – a school, a homeless shelter, a food bank, etc. The new scorecard needs to measure how we are bringing Life – The Kingdom.







New Emergency Night Shelter for Our Neighbors When Temperatures Fall below 40 Degree

As you are aware there is a growing population of homeless in our community. Although our temperatures do not compare to those of the north, we do experience cold temperatures for sleeping outdoors.

We are asking for donations of blankets. When belongings get wet they are useless for keeping someone warm and it can take days for items to dry out.

As you go through your closets this year and find you have unused blankets and/or garments that you could spare, please bring them to the church office and they will be distributed and greatly appreciated.

If you wish to help out with the emergency shelter for homeless neighbors, the DAV on Singleton Road has agreed to be their place to stay whenever the drops below 40 degrees F. They need a hot meal that will feed 6 to 8 persons. If you want to stay as a volunteer, we will orient you there.




