



Hurricane season ends just in time for us to begin our Advent journey. Two months ago, our focus centered on Hurricane season as Dorian swirled off the coast of Florida, destroying the Bahamas and causing most of us to prepare for a potential strike. It is amazing how quickly even the possibility of a hurricane can clear store shelves of water, bread, batteries, generators, and plywood. Even for those of us who are seasoned Floridians, we tend to prepare just in case.

Have you noticed our preparation typically only takes place when we are threatened? The agencies who monitor weather and catastrophes begin warning us about the possibility of a hurricane and the need to prepare before the official season even begins but most of us just make the assumption (or so it seems) that we will not need to prepare this year; surely, we will not get a hurricane this year. I experienced the same attitude in the propane business; customers would wait until the weather forecast said the temperatures would be below freezing and panic. They would call and ask if we knew there was going to be a freeze followed by an explanation of how it was my fault they had waited until the last minute to have their tank filled. Probably more than sixty percent of my customers used this same means of operating. Once, I asked a particularly rude individual if they realized it was winter and it was going to get cold. Their response was "I didn't think it would get cold this year." I asked how old he was and he replied seventy-something. I then asked, "Has it gotten cold all those other years." He said, "Yes, but I didn't think it would this year." We need to learn to prepare for what we can expect to happen. It is the same in our spiritual life. I have heard many times, "You need to be ready because you do not know when the end will come." However, we do not like to think about the end, or our end, do we? Advent is one the times of the Christian year when we are to prepare to receive the risen Christ's return.

Advent is a time of preparation and expectation. We do not expect Jesus to be born but to return. Often we "preacher types" say we are living in the now and the not yet. The now is that Jesus has come to earth as one of us fully human, died, and risen again. We believe he has won the victory over sin and death but that we have not fully received that victory. The "not yet" is the return of Christ in the completion of the victory (final Victory is what we call it in the communion liturgy). The question is: do we see advent in this way? Are we looking for the return of the victorious King or celebrating the birth of a child? I wonder how many live as though we are waiting on the baby to be born another time, to remember that helpless infant, God-Human lying in a manger. That beautiful baby that is still too young to require anything of us, the precious easy to control God. I will admit it is much easier to remember and want the beauty of His birth than the fear of His return. We often sing about what a wonderful day it will be when He returns, while the Jewish faith sees it as a fearsome day of judgement and sorrow. I wonder what it will be. I am sure I cannot imagine such an event, yet I believe it is coming. As I think about Advent and the celebration of Jesus' return, I have to ask am I preparing for that event as I would a hurricane. Am I getting my "house" in order? Am I living like I believe His return is near. Paul taught Early Christians to be prepared every moment. They expected He would return in their lifetime to judge and redeem Israel. They lived each day looking for His return. I do not think we do. Just as with weather events I am afraid we have heard so much about it and witnessed so many would-be soothsayers tell us when the second coming will be, we have become tired of hearing about it. It appears we have adopted the same attitude toward the return of Christ as we have a hurricane or a freeze. We wait and see what happens, thinking there is no use wasting time preparing for something that is not certain to happen soon. We wait and we lull ourselves with the songs of angels and stories of shepherds to fill our advent with wonder and praise for the birth that we forget He is returning.

Advent is a time of preparing our hearts to receive Jesus, not just the baby but also the victorious king that comes in victory to redeem the earth and put evil under His feet permanently. As we approach Advent, I invite us to begin to do a search of our lives, our minds and our hearts to make us ready to receive the King when he returns. As Wesleyans, we believe we have not arrived but are going on to Sanctification, to wholeness in Christ. I know too many who adopt a Calvinist approach: we are saved and that is the end we do not have to do anything else (which really is not what Calvin taught). We are to be always preparing, but even more so during Advent. I know searching and examining our lives is hard but it is a continual process. There are many ways to accomplish this goal. I will recommend two that I believe are positive and possible. The first is the Daily Examen of St. Ignatius. This

practice works through prayer and five steps to take in prayer. (You can Google Daily Examen to get more information). The second is the twelve steps of AA. These steps are a continuing examination of our lives and our thoughts that are valuable not only to those who suffer addictions but to everyone. (You can Google 12 steps AA for more information.) You might find another method but I invite you to join me this Advent season in preparing our hearts to receive not only the baby but also the Risen Victorious King.


