For this year's Advent and Christmas season, we are "listening to the angels" who gathered around for the conception and birth of Jesus. Dr. Marcia McFee (the creator of the Advent/Christmas worship series, "Angels Among Us: #DoNotBeAfraid") says, "we are called to be messengers of Good News. The stories of the angel visits to Zechariah, Mary, Joseph and the shepherds at Jesus' birth will offer us inspiration to incorporate less fear and more goodness into our own lives and therefore, in the lives of all we touch. I think there will be some profound opportunities in this series to deal with our own propensity for fear, get some perspective, and be empowered for new life in the New Year."

Advent and Christmas Season are about another kind of homecoming, the homecoming of Christ to redeem and renew us, this earth, and all creation till "heaven and nature sing" with joy eternally. The Scriptures the church uses for Advent focus first on the final fulfillment, and later on the beginning of that fulfillment in Jesus. Thanks to the revenue raised from leasing out the Education Building to Legacy Charter School, we were able to replace the roof of the Sanctuary with a gleaming new metal roof that has a 50-year warranty.

The next items on the list of things that need to be done for our facility is to repair the ceiling tiles of the Sanctuary and repair the roof of the Education Building. Hurricane Irma caused a leak in the roof of the Education Building and Core Roofing was able to do a temporary repair a few days after the leak was discovered. They will be available to perform a permanent repair in January.

United Methodist Beliefs Class

Whether you have never heard of The Christian Church: "United Methodist" or you have been a United Methodist all of your life, you are cordially invited to a three week Sunday school class on United Methodist beliefs. YOUR Administrative Council

(Entry Three)

In two previous MESSENGER entries, I took the opportunity to introduce myself as your Administrative Council chair, explained my duties as chairman, and gave you an overview of what the purpose, the mission, and the 3 areas of ministry (Nurture, Outreach, and Witness) that all United Methodist churches are to focus their efforts on and toward improving.

What I'd like to do in this edition is speak briefly about our meeting and membership requirements as required by THE BOOK OF DISCIPLINE, and introduce to you the 2017 ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL members and their area of responsibility.

Meetings: The council meets quarterly. The chairperson or the pastor may call special meetings. In order for the council to give adequate consideration to the missional purpose of our church, the first 3 agenda items in any of my meetings are related to our Nurture, Outreach, and Witness ministries. Only after those 3 areas are addressed entirely and sufficiently will the administrative and supportive responsibilities of the church then be given attention. A consensus/discernment model of decision making is recommended and applied. The charge conference determines the size of the church council, as few as 11.

Celebrate Recovery

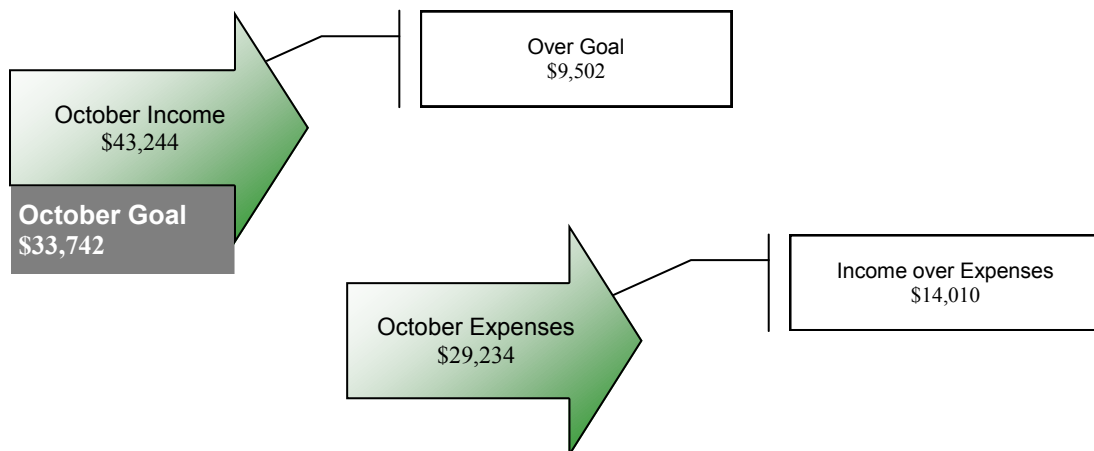

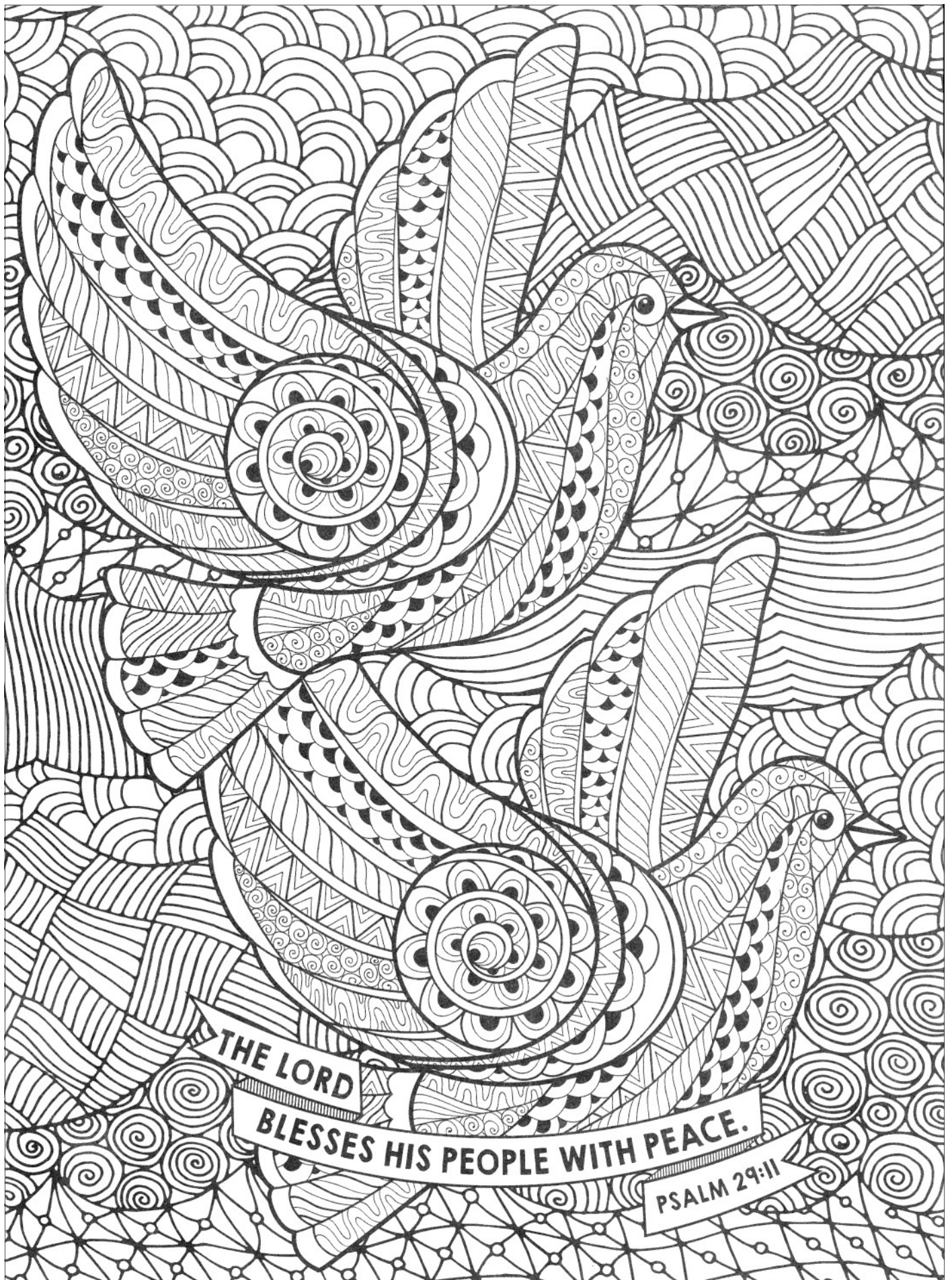

A Journey with Christ

“While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and walked with them.” — Luke 24:15

The Walk to Emmaus (for adults), Face to Face (for those who are 60 +), Journey (for young adults), and Chrysalis (for High School Sophomores-Seniors who are 16-19), weekends are experiences of Christian spiritual renewal and formation that begins with a short three-day course in Christianity. It is an opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in a new way as God’s grace and love is revealed to you through other believers.

The Walk to Emmaus, Journey, and Chrysalis weekend experiences begin with the prayerful discernment and invitation from a sponsor. After one accepts this invitation they complete an application. The Emmaus leaders prayerfully consider each applicant and, in God’s time, the person is invited to attend a three-day experience of New Testament Christianity as a lifestyle. (Please talk with Richard & Grace Barron and/or Fred & Kaye Ball for sponsorship.)

Following the three-day experience, participants are joined in small groups to support each other in their ongoing walk with Christ.

Through the formational process of accountable discipleship in small groups and participation in the Emmaus community, each participant’s individual gifts and servant-leadership skills are developed for use in the local church and its mission. Participants are encouraged to find ways to live out their individual call to discipleship in their home, church, and community.

The objective of Emmaus is to inspire, challenge, and equip the local church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, communities, and places of work. Emmaus lifts up a way for our grace-filled lives to be lived and shared with others.

Face to Face is an experience in the Emmaus tradition for persons 60 and older. This event takes place in our local church and allows participants to “go home at night” as well as might meet once a week for 8 weeks.

News From Our Sister Church in Santa Cruz, Cuba

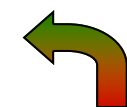
